These opportunities will allow the successful candidates to assist team clinicians and care-giving colleagues with the reception, treatment, and monitoring of all patients within the units. Additionally the successful candidates will oversee and instruct professional veterinary students in preparation of animals and equipment for medical procedures and delivery of care. Duties include, but are not limited to, the following: supervising and performing ordered treatments patients; assisting with diagnostic and therapeutic procedures; transmitting case updates to oncoming colleagues; preparing and submitting charge tickets for all services rendered according to hospital fee schedules; and other duties. The successful candidates will be expected to work 40 hours a week and may be expected to rotate between weekdays and weekends. Holidays may be required and will be based on a team rotation. All shifts are available! Shift differential available for evening hours and weekend hours worked. Successful candidate must be a Registered Veterinary Technician in the state of Ohio and complete a background check.

Required Qualifications: Successful candidates must be a Registered Veterinary Technician in the state of Ohio with an Associate's degree in Animal Health Technology from an approved AVMA Technician Program. Physical requirements include standing for long periods of time, pushing/pulling/lifting up to 50 pounds, exposure to animal dander and/or zoonotic diseases, exposure to needle sticks, hazardous chemicals, and/or bio hazardous waste.
